Hand Rejuvenation

With Fat Grafting, Fillers, or Hand Lift Post-Operative Instructions

Before Your Procedure

- Shower the night before or the morning of your procedure. You can eat and take all of your medications as usual.
- If you're driving to your appointment, bring someone who can drive you home after your procedure.

After Surgery

This is a minimally invasive regenerative aesthetic procedure for the hands. Care for your operated site as instructed by Dr. Tran. As a reminder, you may follow this general advice:

- You may feel numbness in the hands after the procedure due to local anesthetic injections. This sensation should fade away after 4 hours.
- If your wrists were wrapped in gauzes, you may remove them after 12 hours following the procedure. Keep the bandage on the administered site dry and clean.
- Take your antibiotic as instructed if you were prescribed by Dr. Tran.
- Acetaminophen and ibuprofen may be taken to reduce pain as needed.

Follow-up Visit

At your pre-operative appointment, our office staff will schedule your post-operative visit within 7-10 days following the operation. At this appointment, Dr. Tran will check-up on your results and provide you with further instructions of care as needed.

Possible Problems/Emergency

If you develop any symptoms such as fevers with temperature greater than 101.5 F, chills, persistent nausea and vomiting, inability to urinate, persistent numbness/tingling of fingers, or any increasing pain not controlled with medications, please contact our office at 714-839-8000 between the hours of 9AM-6PM on Monday-Thursday and 9AM-1PM on Friday; or you may reach us at 714-860-3588 after hours. If you are unable to reach your surgeon or a member of his staff, go to the Emergency Room closest to you.
